The parents were informed of the internal assessment scores for each subject.
















During her welcome speech, the Head of Department, Dr. Berny B. Raj, provided a brief overview of the course, the valuation method, and the details of the internal examination. During the presidential address, our respected principal, Dr.

Aswathy Sugunan, stressed the importance of co-curricular and extracurricular activities for students. 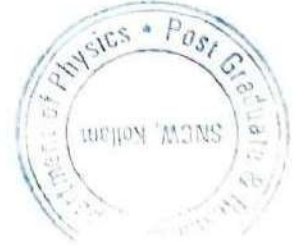

The Department of Geography at Sree Narayana College for Women, Kollam, organized a memorable field trip for sixth semester students to Kullu, Manali and Agra from February 4 to February 12, 2024.
