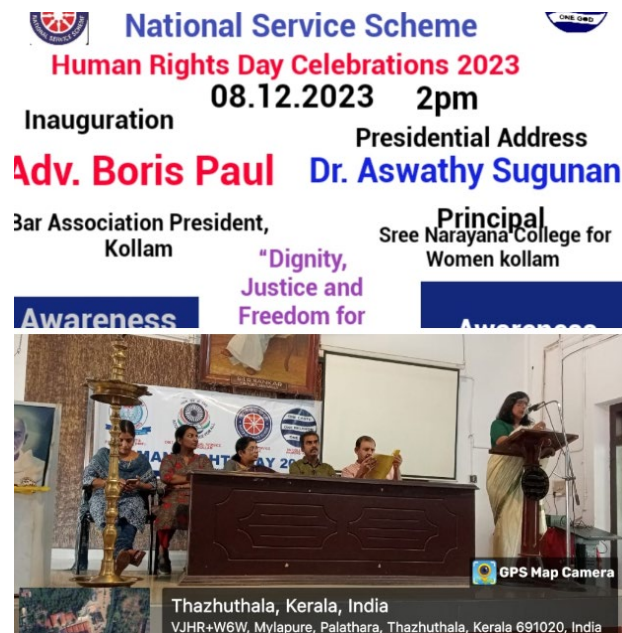

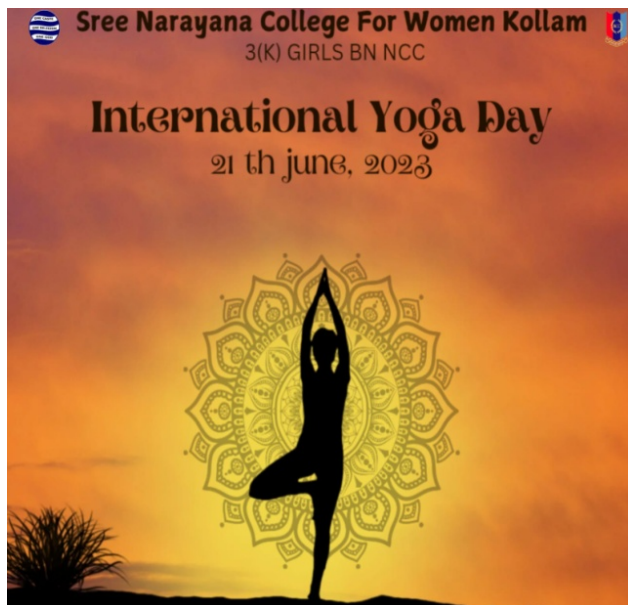

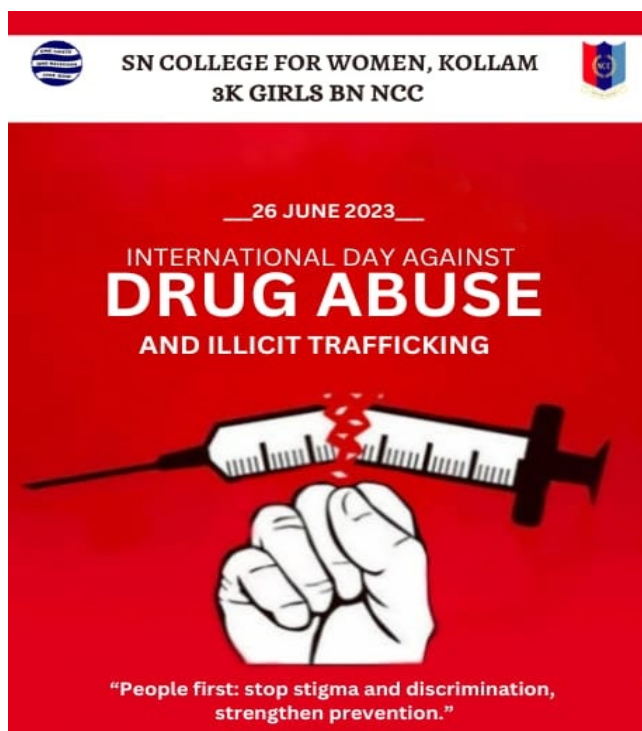

The aim of the literacy day is "Building the foundation for sustainable and peaceful societies."

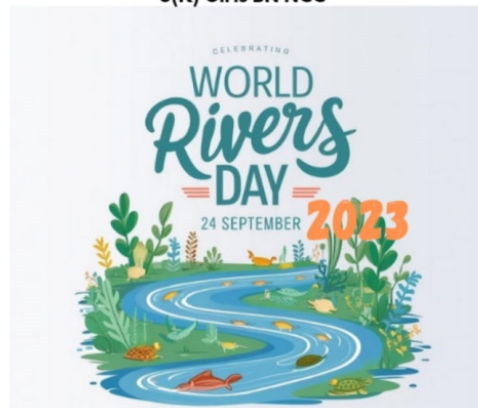


WORLD RIVERS DAY ON 24th SEPTEMBER 2023

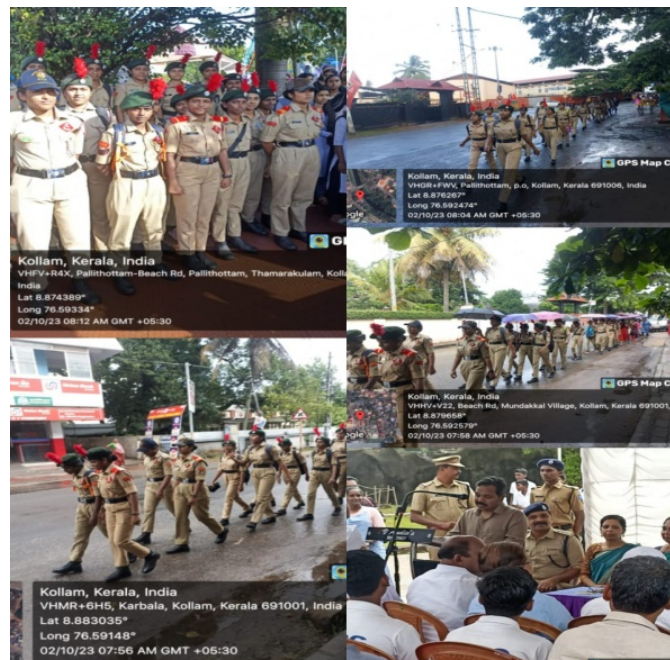
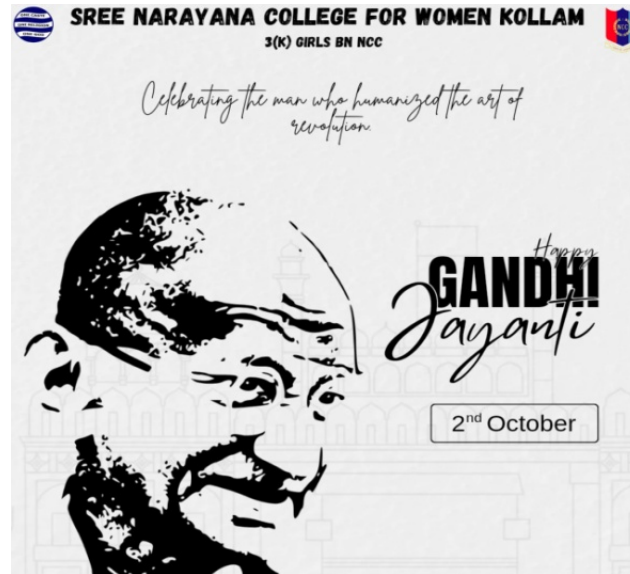

WORLD HEART DAY ON 5th OCTOBER 2023

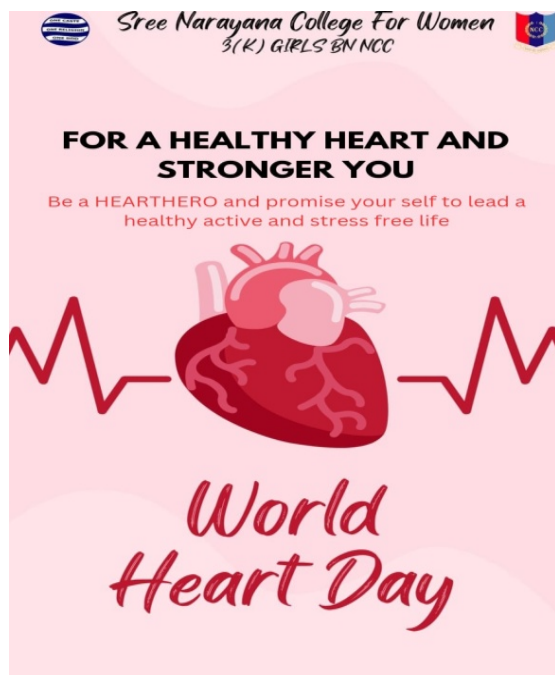

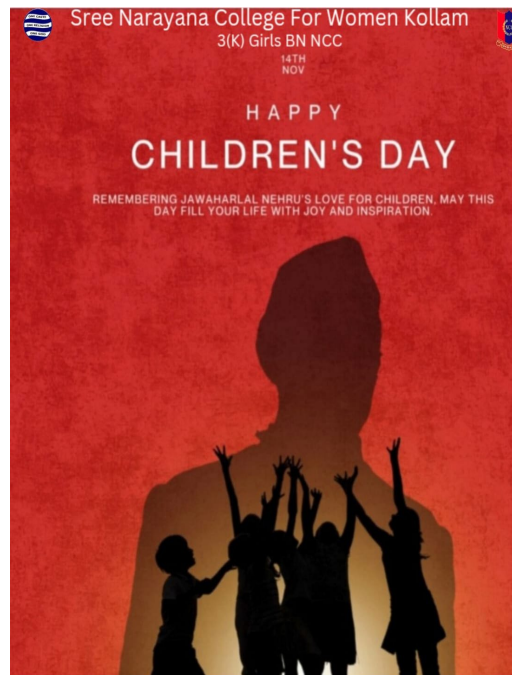


CHILDREN'S DAY 14th NOVEMBER 2023

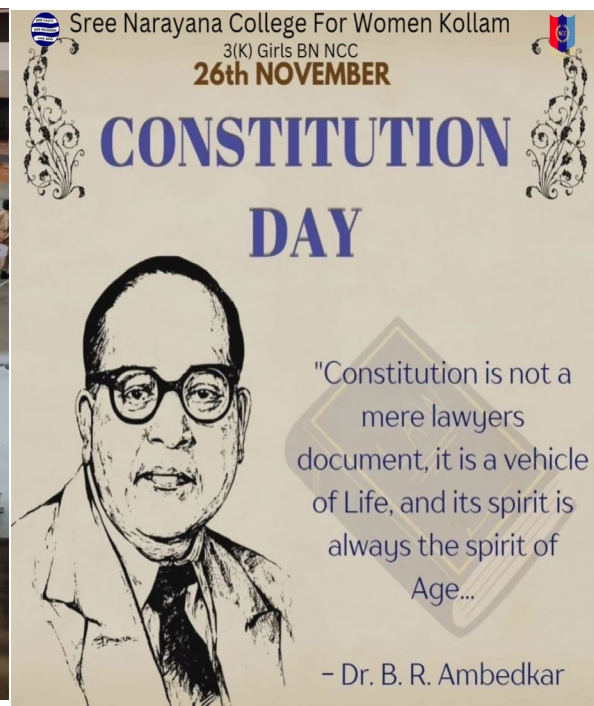
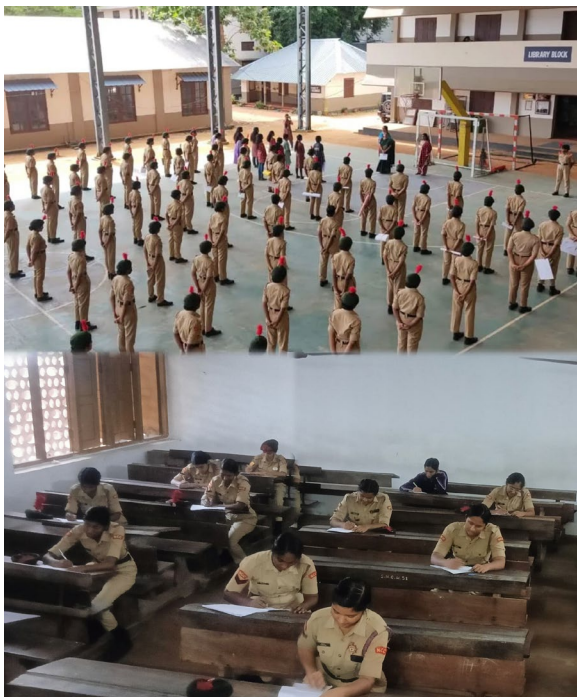


NATIONAL CONSTITUTION DAY 26 NOVEMBER 2023

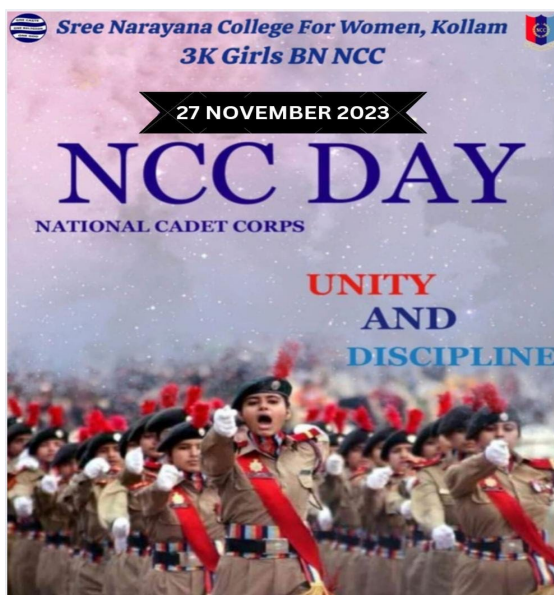


NATIONAL CADET CORPS DAY ON 27th NOVEMBER 2023

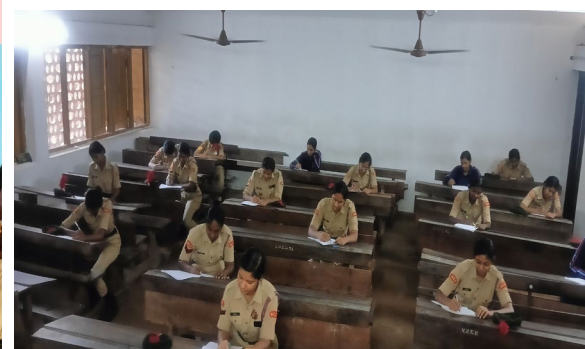
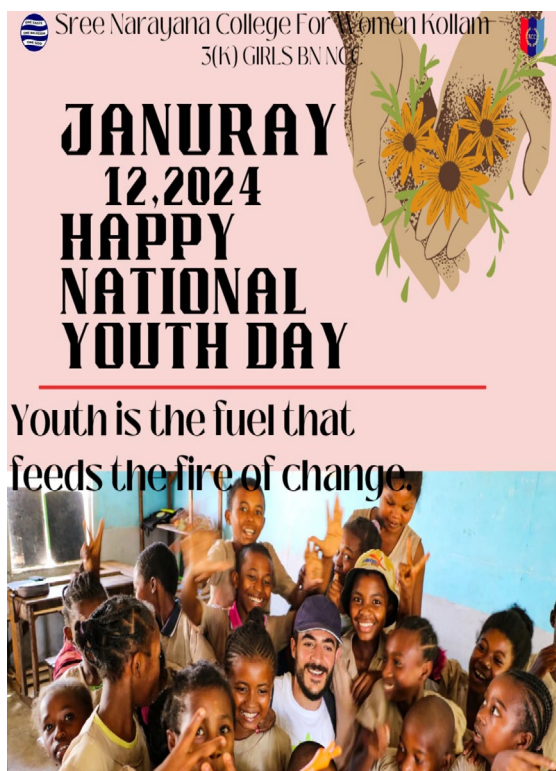


NATIONAL YOUTH DAY 12th JANUARY 2024

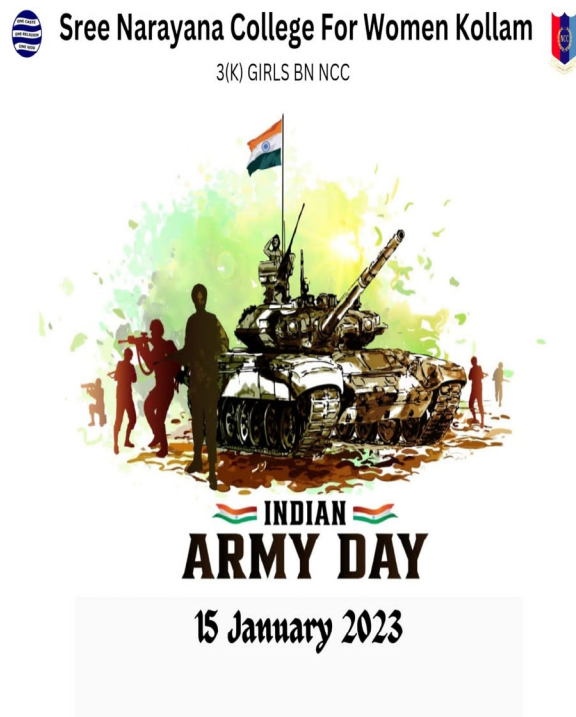


INDIAN ARMY DAY 15th OCTOBER 2024
